1. Purpose

This Information Technology Policy (ITP) establishes the standard for electronic postmarks.

In November 2006, the General Assembly of Pennsylvania passed, and the governor signed into law Act 173 of 2006, P.L. 1559, No. 173, as:

An act amending the act of December 16, 1999 (P.L. 971, No.69), known as the Electronic Transactions Act, providing for the definition of "United States Postal Service Electronic Postmark," and further providing for acceptance and distribution of electronic records.

The United States Postal System Electronic Postmark (USPS EPM) is an electronic version of certified mail. USPS EPM is used to "stamp" an e-mail (with optional attachments) and provides tracking and auditing information equal to that of a piece of certified mail.

2. Scope

This ITP applies to all offices, departments, boards, commissions and councils under the Governor's jurisdiction (hereinafter referred to as "agencies"). Agencies not under the Governor's jurisdiction are strongly encouraged to follow this ITP.

3. Policy

USPS EPM or other similar services may be acceptable, electronic alternatives to communication via certified mail except USPS EPM shall not be used for service of original process of a summons, complaint or other papers for the purpose of obtaining jurisdiction over a defendant in a lawsuit.

Use of such services is subject to review by the agency's legal department (in light of agency business processes and contractual requirements) and then by the Office of Administration, Office for Information Technology.
