- Data Program Task Force (Pages 5-9):
 - Formalized goals and objectives to include in-person workshops based on PA base maps.
 - 24 counties have access to spatial interface applications (GIS DataHub).



- PEMA received 23 applications for \$2.76M to support NG911 GIS.
- Raystown elevation-derived hydrography pilot underway.
- For civic boundaries, DCED/DOT data exchange agreement in place.
- Talk of creating parcel / cadastral steering committee formation.
- Service Delivery Task Force (Pages 10-11):
 - As of November 15th, 59 counties and 1 planning commission have signed data sharing agreements.
 - Special report of COVID-19 is nearly complete.
 - PEMA Imagery Project report is available to the GeoBoard. Adams County imagery is complete; Franklin County will be next.
 - o Draft implementation goals for Service Delivery Task Force created.
- Governance Task Force (Page 12):
 - Strategic Plan implementation approach templates were distributed to each Task Force.
 - Response documents due to Governance Task Force by December 25, 2021 and the Governance Task Force will release the document for new year.
 - HB 609 No significant change in status since 5/5/2021 when referred to Senate Committee for Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure.
 - Geospatial census opportunity is being discussed. Information gathering and evaluating activities are in progress.

Executive Director Engagement

Approach for Executive Director engagement priorities and actions (Pages 13–15)

- John MacMillan and Eric Jespersen led the discussion regarding the direction of the SGCB by building on the established Strategic Plan, involving all task forces and holding spring workshops.
- Membership should be seeking opportunities to carry messages to external partners counties, municipalities and townships.

New Business (Page 16)

- Barry Hutchins informed the group of the NENA joint meeting that was held during the 1st week of November 2021. Version 2 of data model soon to be released in 3D.
- Next Joint Task Force meeting is 2/10/2022 with 2/1/2022 the deadline for topic submission.

Guided Discussion (Pages 17-18)

- Connecting with counties for information or data sharing opportunities.
- Risk versus consequence management: what coodintion opportunities exist to provide the best data to those in risk management?
- Are we getting data and information to the decision makers?
- Captured ideas / suggestions for data follow:
 - Is there a role in terms of acquiring data or building data that would support infrastructure efforts? For example, broadband data, electric car charging stations.
 - PASDA suggested an application that would include a companion story map, link to data, resources, and highlight gaps about "Infrastructure in PA: challenges, opportunities and goals".
 - Spatial data rendering and analysis likely needed for identifying underserved and unserved broadband internet areas and, potentially, addresses. Was any of this information gathered in the NG911 GIS survey or does PUC have relevant information?
 - PASDA has some academic partners but it would be an efficiency opportunity if state agencies that contract with universities and colleges required that such data is shared back.
 - NextGen911 relies heavily on using spatial data.
- GIS Talent
 - Retain / develop GIS knowledge and talent in-state including K-12 and post-secondary.
 - California University contacted PEMA for information on incorporating NG911 into their GIS curriculum. PEMA has been assisting with these efforts and is willing to offer the same to other institutions. Scott Drzyzga indicated that Shippensburg University may be another relevant institution.
